



The Hotel Principi di Piemonte is in the cultural heart of Turino, providing guests with a 5-star luxury setting in an unbeatable location. In the Rationalist-era building, you'll find a refined spa and wellness centre along with an upscale restaurant focused on traditional cuisine, Casa di Savoia. Throughout your stay, you'll be just steps away from many of Turino's highlights, including some of the most charming piazzas and grand palaces.

You'll be staying in Principi di Piemonte's Junior Suite, furnished in a modern Italian style with a full living area and desk. From your room, you'll look out over the city, perhaps glimpsing the nearby Mole Antonelliana landmark or the faraway snow capped Alps.

Start your first full day in Torino with a visit to the FCA Heritage Hub, an exhibit in the heart of a Fiat manufacturing plant where you'll find classic Alfa Romeo, Fiat, Lancia, and Abarth cars on display. Your private guided visit will illuminate the inner workings of the Mirafiori plant, as well as the story behind one of the most powerful car companies.

Once you've had your fill of rich automotive history, it's time for lunch at Da Michele, an eatery that has been run by three generations of Turinese restaurateurs, and produces homestyle cooking backed with passion. Here you have the chance to try a number of creative housemade pastas, like tajarin (the regional word for taglierini, meaning small cuts) made with asparagus-infused dough, or tagliatelle with wild boar ragù.

Indulge in another Italian tradition—aperitivo—in the garden patio of Bar Cavour before dinner upstairs at Michelin-starred Del Cambio. Here, Torino-born chef Matteo Baronetto and his team turn to classic Piedmontese dishes (like vitello tonnato, veal in a creamy tuna sauce) while also channelling their curiosity into improvisation, which shines in the tasting menus. A meal may open with an appetiser plate blending cuttlefish nigiri with oyster, mussel, wagyu, and zucchini blossoms, or include pigeon alla diavola combined with mango, peach, and citrus sesame. This restaurant is known for excellent local cuisine and its wine collection of some 18,000 bottles.

Fully sated, you'll be glad for the ten-minute stroll (or quick ride) back to the hotel after your meal!

Your Sunday in Torino begins with a visit to the largest Egyptian Museum outside of Cairo. The origins of this museum date back to the 17th century, and its exhibits have told the story of Egyptian culture ever since. From there, you'll head to Casa Fiore, a favorite Torino restaurant that offers beautifully presented local dishes (like roasted octopus on a bed of potato crema, or the Piedmontese version of steak tartare laden with aged parmesan) and a thorough wine list.

A special automotive treat is in store, with a private visit to the MAUTO National Museum of Automobiles, open exclusively for you this evening. The MAUTO Museum pays homage to the Agnelli family who brought Fiat to greatness. Enjoy a private guided tour through the museum, home to a rare collection of over 200 automobiles from 80 international car brands in a 200,000 square feet property. The museum was opened in 1932 by Cesare Goria Gatti and Roberto Biscaretti di Ruffia, two of the original Fiat founders.

After your tour, you'll get the unique opportunity to join museum chairman Benedetto Camerana (who is continuing the Agnelli family's great legacy) for a welcome drink before dinner with prestigious car designers and collectors alike. This by-invitation-only meal will be served in the museum, surrounded by the most precious collection of Formula 1 vintage cars, including the Silver Arrow once driven by Juan Manuel Fangio. Your dinner this evening is sure to be one of the most memorable experiences of your visit to Italy.

Gino Macaluso, a watch designer who headed the Fiat rally team in the 7Os, once called the automobile "one of the most vivid expressions of creativity." His rally car collection is perhaps the largest and most impressive in the world, and you'll have the unique opportunity to see it on a private guided tour today while learning about the competitive culture of automobile racing in the 6Os and 7Os.

After your foray into the world of Gino Macaluso, lunch at La Valle in the outskirts of the city provides you with a seasonal expression of traditional local cuisine as bright, fresh ingredients collide. Think Carmagnola rabbit paired with cherries, spaghetti with mussels and creamy stracciatella cheese, and Piedmontese beef alongside local asparagus.

Dinner is at Ristorante 3 Galline, one of the best-known Turinese restaurants that is full of rustic charm. Surrounded by dark wood panelling and a welcoming atmosphere, you'll sample classic country cooking like traditional agnolotti stuffed pasta in a flavourful gravy, or tender veal cheek slow-cooked in Nebbiolo wine, and more adventurous dishes like gnocchi doused in beetroot cream with a blue cheese fondue and toasted walnuts. This restaurant has been around since the 16th century, and is a must-visit when in Torino.



This morning, you'll trade one historic northern Italian city for another as you head to Milan. The city is perhaps best known for its grand Duomo cathedral and fashion scene, although its allure stretches far beyond both. You'll get your first glimpse of the Milanese sense of style at your 5-star accommodation: The Grand Hotel et de Milan. This hotel opened in 1863, and its rooms feature carefully curated decorations that create visual harmony while honouring the history of the place. Enjoy some time at your leisure before the day's adventure begins.

The first stop is lunch at II Salumaio di Montenapoleone, located just a short walk from the hotel. Here, too, history lives on in the building, the Bagatti Valsecchi palace and museum with a renaissance courtyard. Because this is a *salumaio* (butcher shop), plenty of cured meats are on offer, along with the famous saffron-tinged *risotto alla Milanese*, Milanese breaded veal cutlet, and a number of gourmet specials.

After some free time, bear witness to Italy's incredible artistic legacy with a visit to The Last Supper Museum (Museo Cenacolo Vinciano) to see Leonardo Da Vinci's genius.

Tonight's aperitivo and dinner are at Lucid Milano, one of the most exclusive clubs in the city that is typically open to members only.


Grand Hotel et de Milan

Your 5-star accommodation in Milan's upscale shopping neighbourhood known as Quadrilatero della Moda, or the Montenapoleone District, has been a part of the city's cultural heritage since its opening in 1863. After all, the world's most famous opera house is just steps away (along with the Duomo, financial district, and most famous upscale shopping areas), and composer Giuseppe Verdi stayed here so often that the hotel was once known as "Verdi's House." While there have been several renovations over the years, each has served to further unlock and highlight the building's historical origins.

Rooms in the Grand Hotel et de Milan each have their own unique character, with art and antiques as the focal point. You'll stay in a Junior Suite, where you'll look out on the city or a quiet courtyard and have a full lounge at your disposal.

Alfa Romeo is one of the most storied luxury car brands, and your private guided visit of the Museo Alfa Romeo this morning is sure to be a thrill for all automobile enthusiasts. After all, there's more than a century of history preserved in the museum's collections, including an exhibit on what the brand means to the Italian Carabinieri. You'll also have a chance to see the private historical archives on this tour, an opportunity that is typically off-limits to visitors.

Bring your appetite to lunch at 2 Michelin star D'O, the brainchild of Davide Oldani. Oldani opened D'O in 2003, and immediately garnered attention for his approach, called "cucina POP," a mix of accessibility and seasonality. At Oldani's D'O, simple preparation allows the flavours behind four different tasting menus to shine.

To visit Zagato, the car design factory named for Ugo Zagato, is to understand the beautiful history of Italian automotives, and you'll have special access this afternoon that allows you to do just that. It was here that models such as the Fulvia Sport and Maserati Spyder got their big debut. Thanks to Zagato's relationship with Alfa Romeo, the factory often built special-edition models for Alfa Romeo and others. This factory is not a typical museum or showroom, but a paradise of sorts for car connoisseurs.

After returning to the hotel for some leisure time, enjoy dinner with a close-up view of Milan's most impressive cathedral at Da Giacomo Arengario. The art deco space in Milan's most famous restaurant offers charming surroundings, while the menu focuses on fresh Mediterranean flavours, with standouts like beef tartare with creamy burrata cheese and black truffle, lobster ravioli in a goat cheese and lemon cream sauce, and—of course—the traditional cotoletta alla Milanese.

Today, round out your cultural understanding of Milan with a backstage pass of sorts to the Teatro alla Scala. Here, you'll visit the workshops, the enormous facility where the sets, costumes, mechanics, and props are designed for the world's most prestigious opera house.

Later in the morning, head to the Armani Silos, an exhibition space dedicated to the famous Italian fashion brand. You'll have the chance to visit all three archive floors, which are open by invitation only. Glimpse the designer's first work and step through the legacy of the storied brand on this special tour before you're served a private lunch in the silos.

Because Milan is the shopping capital of Italy, you'll also get a private visit to the Giorgio Armani boutique in Via Sant'Andrea and private visits to other luxury boutiques in the Via Montenapoleone district.

Dinner tonight takes place at Portrait Milano's 10_11, a restaurant owned by the Ferragamo family that is located at the crossing of two very different streets—one that leads to the high-end, elegant part of the city and the other that runs straight to the centre of Milan. The menu at 10_11 truly represents northern Italy, with signature dishes such as chef Alberto Quadrio's take on Alfredo sauce (pasta with water and parmesan, called "white pasta"), beef tartare with smoked mayonnaise and crispy rice chips, and Tuscan tiramisù.

To better understand the impact your journey is having on the local community, you'll visit the Fondazione TOG today, which works to support children affected by nervous system disorders and their families with tailored rehabilitation programs. You'll get a chance to tour their new centre and learn more about their work before heading to your midday meal.

For lunch, dine at Paper Moon Giardino, where high-end cuisine is served in a grand palace near a fantastical secret garden. The menu offers some of the most authentic and high-quality Italian food you'll find in Milan, with a focus on presentation—each plate is practically an art form! Try the restaurant's homemade *pappardelle* pasta with bacon in a tomato cream sauce, grilled Mediterranean squid, or tender *ossobuco* with saffron risotto.

Villa Necchi Campiglio is the nearly 90-year-old creation of architect Piero Portaluppi, and is a prime example of a noble home from the 1930s. In a guided visit, see the villa's many grand rooms and learn about the family that once called the place home.

After some leisure time in the afternoon, you'll have dinner at Ristorante Bouecc, a Milan institution that dates back to 1676 and is famous for its high standards of service. You'll have the chance to eat authentic local dishes as well as those inspired by places from afar.

Welcome to Alba in the UNESCO World Heritage Vineyard Landscape of Piedmont, the land of some of the best-known wines in the world (think Barolo or Barbaresco) where vineyards meet rolling hills and hazelnut groves. You'll stay at Castello di Guarene, a grand 18th-century castle that has been converted into a luxury resort with opulent rooms and well-manicured gardens, plus views out over the rolling hills.

After lunch in the hotel restaurant, which serves local, seasonal items, you'll transfer half an hour toward the starting point for your hot air balloon ride. Watch in awe as the balloon inflates, then journey across the rolling hills of the Langhe wine region, even more stunning from above. You'll see rows of neatly maintained grape vines where some of the best wine in the world is grown, and ancient hamlets toppling over hills in the countryside.

Celebrate a glorious ride and soft landing with an aperitivo at the end of today's journey. You'll snack on roasted hazelnuts, salami, cheese, fruit juice, and sparkling wine—all locally sourced—before heading to Ristorante lo e Luna. This restaurant, powered by chef Davide Odore, is all about "refined simplicity."

Castello di Guarene

This imposing 18th-century palace in the Langhe area of Piedmont was originally built for the Counts of Roero, who played an important role in the aristocracy at that time. There is, of course, a grand dining hall and extensive wine cellar, plus a wellness centre tucked into magical caves.

You'll stay in deluxe rooms that are opulently decorated and comfortably furnished. Depending on your specific room, you may have a view of the gardens, the Roero wine appellation, the hills and vineyards of the Langhe, or the magnificent Alps.

Next it's time for a cooking class, during which time a chef will guide you to prepare two courses, one of which includes the famous Alba white truffle. You'll get to taste the fruits of your labour, of course, while sipping wine. Then dive deeper into the world of Langhe wines with the help of a sommelier from AIS Piedmont, who will take you on a journey through the wines of the region and all of their characteristics.

The timing of your visit is just right, aligning with the Alba White Truffle Fair, which showcases high-end Italian cuisine with a spotlight on truffles. A truffle market, cooking show, and other remarkable culinary experiences are on display, along with traditional folklore events that have taken place in this part of Italy for generations.

After returning to the hotel for some free time, you'll dine at traditional restaurant Miralanghe, where you can sample the highlights of regional cuisine.


