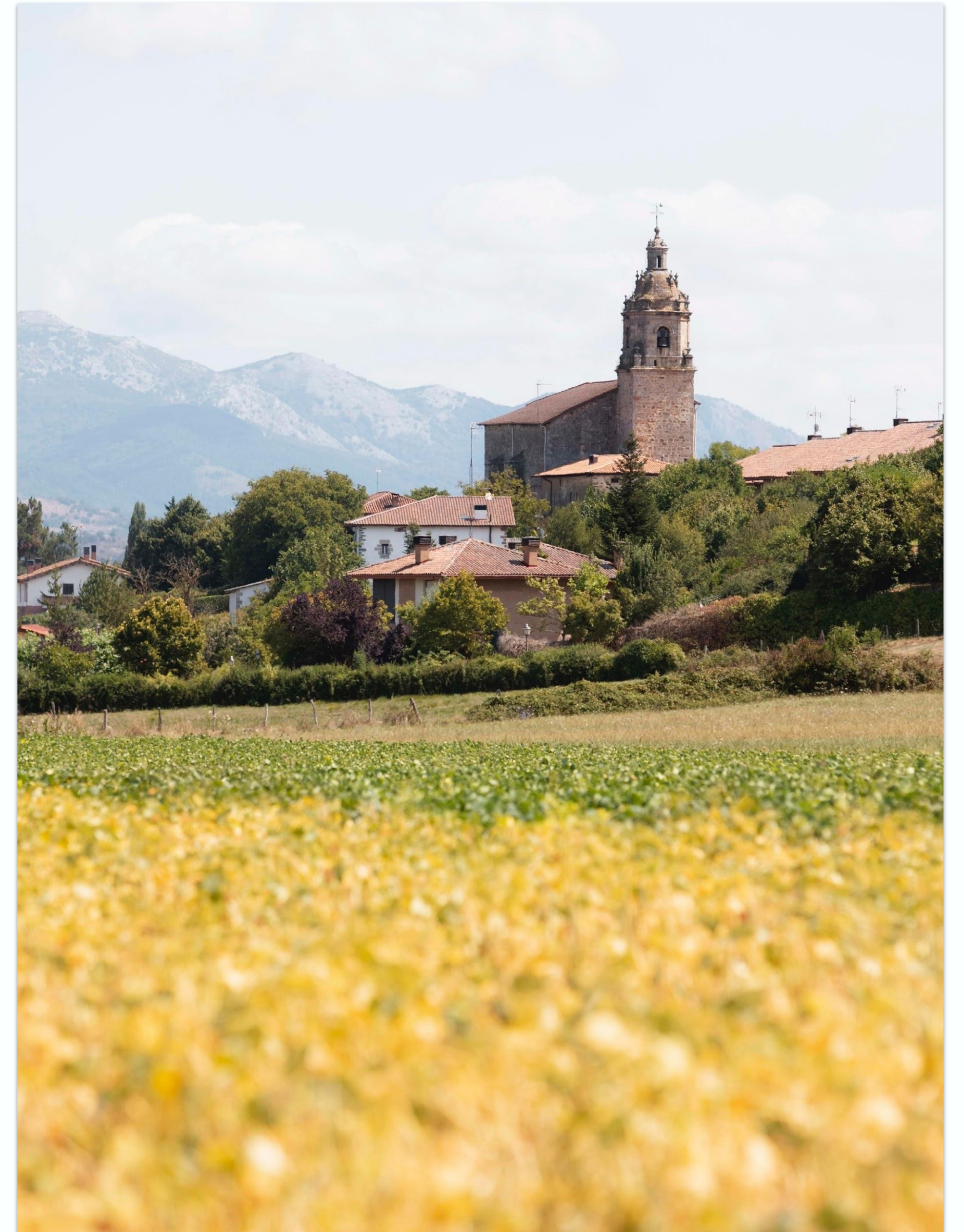

We'll give you some time to settle in after your journey before a complimentary welcome massage to ease any remaining tension from your travels. In the evening, join us for a welcome drink and dinner in the hotel's Ristorante Casa Savoia, which features a modern take on classic Italian cuisine.

Your day begins with a visit to the MAUTO National Museum of Automobiles, which pays homage to the Agnelli family who brought Fiat to greatness. Enjoy a private guided tour through the museum, home to a rare collection of over 200 automobiles from 80 international car brands in a 200,000 square feet property. The museum was opened in 1932 by Cesare Goria Gatti and Roberto Biscaretti di Ruffia, two of the original Fiat founders. Throughout your visit, you'll come to understand how the automobile industry has evolved over time, as exhibits hash out both failures and great successes in the world of cars.

After your tour, you'll enjoy a welcome drink hosted by the museum before lunch. Once you've returned to the hotel, you're welcome to spend a few hours at your leisure or indulge in spa activities.

In the evening, you'll head to Casa Fiore, a favourite Torino restaurant that offers beautifully presented local dishes (like roasted octopus on a bed of potato crema, or the Piedmontese version of steak tartare laden with aged parmesan) and a thorough wine list.

Start your day with a visit to the FCA Heritage Hub, an exhibit in the heart of a Fiat manufacturing plant where you'll find classic Alfa Romeo, Fiat, Lancia, and Abarth cars on display. Your private guided visit will illuminate the inner workings of the Mirafiori plant, as well as the story behind one of the most powerful car companies.

After this exciting automotive adventure, visit Bar Cavour for an aperitivo before lunch upstairs at Michelin-starred Del Cambio. Here, Torino-born chef Matteo Baronetto and his team turn to classic Piedmontese dishes (like vitello tonnato, veal in a creamy tuna sauce) while also channeling their curiosity into improvisation, which shines in the tasting menus. A meal may open with an appetiser plate blending cuttlefish nigiri with oyster, mussel, wagyu, and zucchini blossoms, or include pigeon alla diavola combined with mango, peach, and citrus. This restaurant is known for excellent local cuisine and its wine collection of some 18,000 bottles.

Once you've returned to the hotel, take some time to visit the largest Egyptian museum outside of Cairo, or take part in the Italian tradition of dolce far niente (the sweetness of doing nothing).

Dinner tonight is at Ristorante Ceccarelli, where elements of Tuscan and Piedmontese cuisine meet. You can eat typical Piedmontese dishes like agnolotti stuffed pasta and local *fassone* beef, or opt for Tuscan fish stew and the flavourful chianina steak.

Gino Macaluso, a watch designer who headed the Fiat rally team in the 70s, once called the automobile “one of the most vivid expressions of creativity.” His rally car collection is perhaps the largest and most impressive in the world, and you’ll have the unique opportunity to see it on a private guided tour today while learning about the competitive culture of automobile racing in the 60s and 70s.

After your foray into the world of Gino Macaluso, lunch at La Valle in the outskirts of the city provides you with a seasonal expression of traditional local cuisine as bright, fresh ingredients collide. Think Carmagnola rabbit paired with cherries, spaghetti with mussels and creamy straciatella cheese, and Piedmontese beef alongside local asparagus. In the afternoon, return to the hotel for a bit of leisure time or choose to visit the Egyptian Museum—the world’s largest outside of Cairo

Dinner is at Ristorante 3 Galline, one of the best-known Turinese restaurants that is full of rustic charm. Surrounded by dark wood panelling and a welcoming atmosphere, you’ll sample classic country cooking like traditional agnolotti stuffed pasta in a flavourful gravy, or tender veal cheek slow-cooked in Nebbiolo wine, and more adventurous dishes like gnocchi doused in beetroot cream with a blue cheese fondue and toasted walnuts. This restaurant has been around since the 16th century, and is a must-visit when in Torino.

[Lake Maggiore](#) skirts the southern Alps, with shores in both Italy and Switzerland. Its beauty is striking, blending distant alpine features with clear waters and charming small towns. This lake has always played an important role in Italy's history, and during the Roman times served as part of an important maritime line, stretching all the way to the Adriatic Sea.

After a scenic journey to the famous resort town of Stresa, you'll settle into life at the Grand Hotel des Iles Borromées & Spa, an elegant 5-star waterfront hotel home to world-class spa facilities. This hotel is known as one of Ernest Hemingway's favorite hideouts, and has a suite dedicated to the writer.

Enjoy lunch at the lakefront hotel restaurant, Il Borromeo, before you're free to indulge in spa and wellness treatments, lounge around the hotel grounds or take a dip in the pool and soak up mountain views.

In the evening, a private sunset cruise will bring you to the small island Isola dei Pescatori to see the lake from a different view. It's on this island—once a simple fishing village—where you'll dine under the care of Michelin 2-star chef Marco Sacco. Sacco's Il Verbano plays with the concept of 'suspension of time,' providing local flavors and romantic views worth slowing down for. Delight in meals such as risotto in a lake fish ragout paired with char tartare or pasta with potatoes and mussels in a salted lemon sauce—just make sure to save room for dessert, with treats like mille-feuilles topped with eggnog foam, rich gianduja chocolate, and berries.

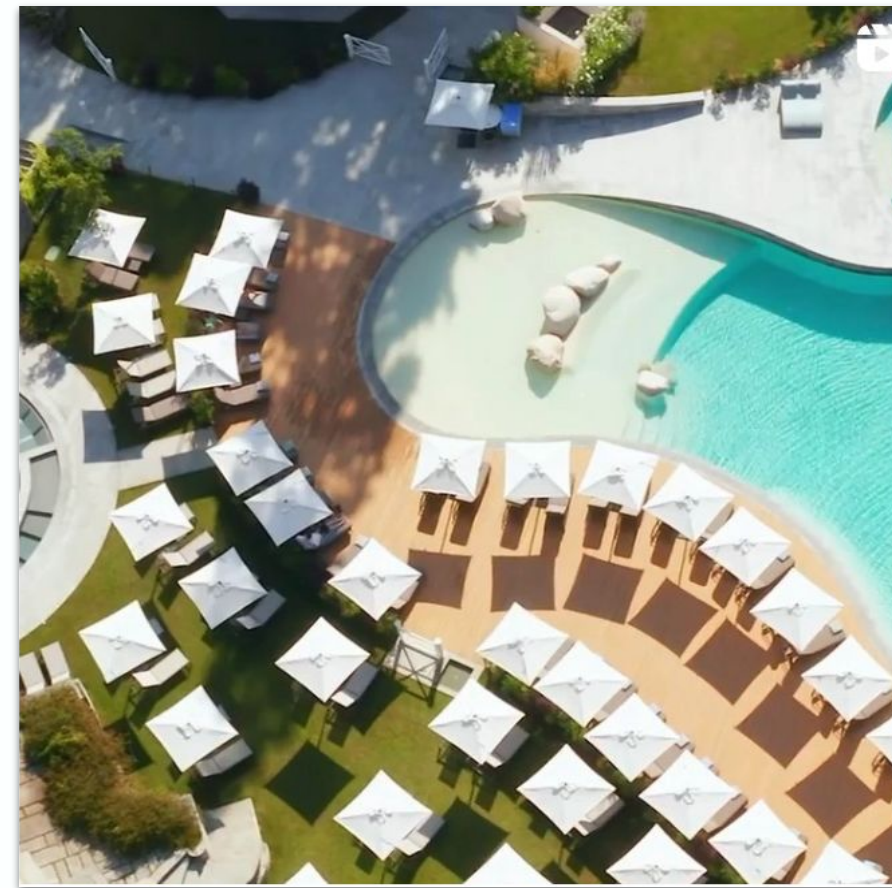

Grand Hotel des Iles Borromées

The Grand Hotel des Iles Borromeés is a 5-star accommodation in the resort town of Stresa that exemplifies elegance and serves as your gateway to the magnificent Lake Maggiore. This property has been around since the mid-19th century, when it was established to give visitors access to (and a clear view of) the Borromean Islands. While it has welcomed many esteemed guests over the years, this hotel is perhaps best known for hosting Ernest Hemingway, who mentioned the property in his novel *Farewell to Arms*.

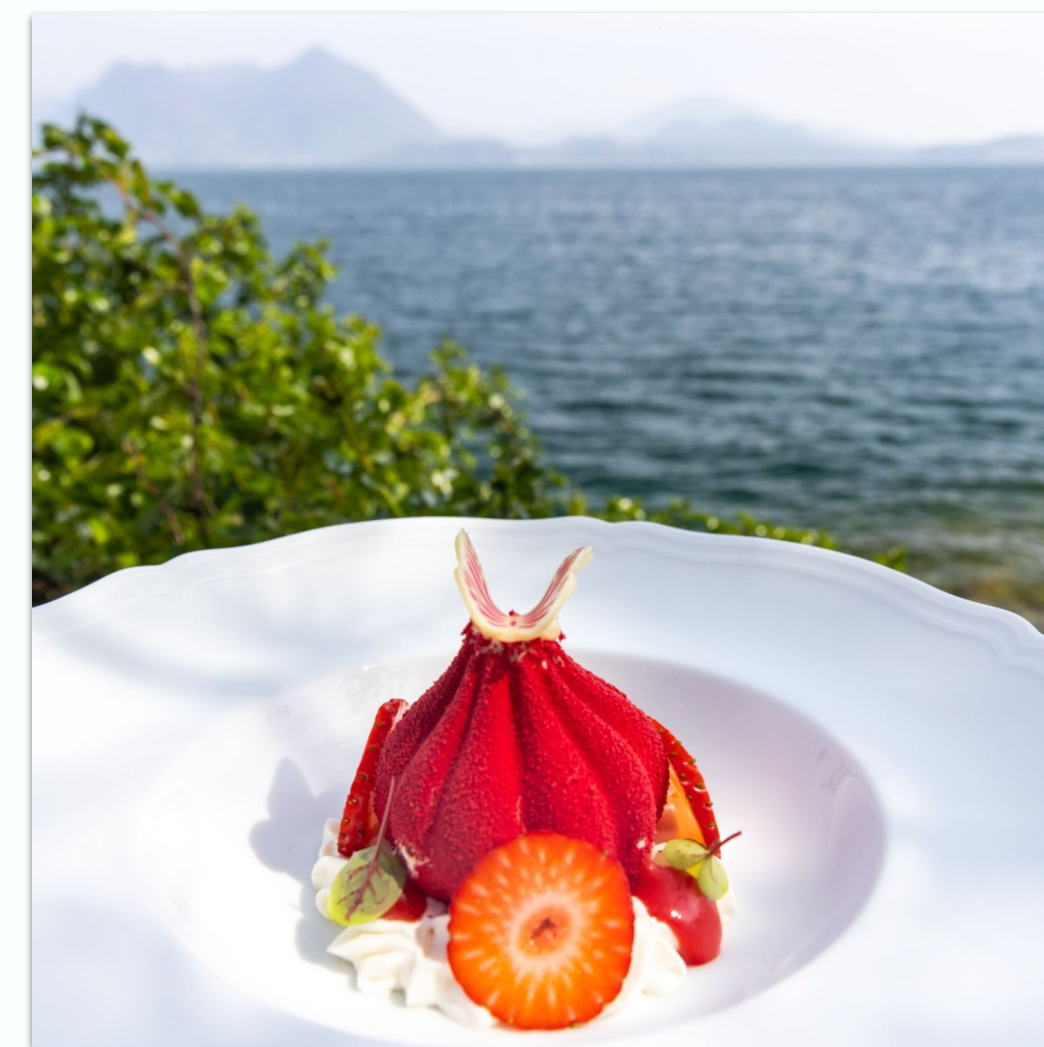
During your stay, you'll have access to the hotel's world-class spa facilities, as well as its beautiful grounds. You'll be surrounded by grand architecture and opulent furnishings, framed by views of the lake and distant mountains. On this adventure, you'll stay in a Junior Suite looking out on the water, complete with decorated marble bathrooms, a whirlpool bathtub, and a separate living room area furnished with a plush couch, chairs, and a breakfast table.

Today the adventure you've been waiting for is in store: your chance to drive a classic Italian car. The journey begins right at your front doorstep, where the cars are waiting for you. Before hitting the road you'll get a thorough briefing on the vehicle and itinerary. From there, you'll put your driving skills to the test on the private Borromea historical route (famous for the Car Coppa Stresa) to the Parco del Mottarone.

Making this journey would be exciting enough in any vehicle, but to do so in a classic Italian sports car is like something out of a dream. You'll reach Parco del Mottarone, with views over the great expanses of water dotted with islands—a total of seven lakes are visible from the summit. Here, the Apennines and Alps border the horizon, leading to the Monte Rosa massif, Monviso (high point of the Cottian Alps), and Swiss mountain crests.

After this thrilling ride, you'll get to soak up the view some more with lunch at Villa Pizzini, a 19th-century hunting lodge that serves up seasonal local dishes in an intimate atmosphere. The villa is reserved just for you today, and will serve a tailor made lunch. To break up the scenic drive on the way back, you'll first stop at Villa Taranto for a visit to the estate's magnificent gardens before returning along the lake to the hotel.

To wind down from a spectacular day, you'll head into the village of Stresa for a casual dinner before retiring for the evening.

You'll make the most of your time on Lake Maggiore today with some island hopping. First, a private boat takes you to Isola Madre, the largest of the Borromean Islands that make up a UNESCO World Heritage destination. In a guided visit, you'll learn about the island's history, see the fairytale-like English Garden, and wander the open halls at one Borromeo Palace.

The midday meal at Ristorante Milano combines excellent cuisine with history and art, giving you a more nuanced sense of life on the lake. Chef Agostino Sala strives for harmony amid complexity, whether in his lake fish tartare, risotto with buttermilk and teriyaki eel, or thyme-smoked lamb.

Soon it's time to visit another UNESCO-recognized island: Isola Bella. It wasn't until 1630 that this island was transformed into a destination with the construction of a grand palace. Inside the palace, you'll find a baroque gallery and spectacular ground floor rooms made up of walls fitted with shells, while outside gardens spill out onto the many terraces and the grand Teatro Massimo monument stands proud.

Typical local fare is on offer this evening at La Rampolina Osteria in the hills. Here, the kitchen dresses up simple dishes, turning pasta aglio, olio, e peperoncino (garlic, oil, and chilli) into a memorable meal with the addition of trout roe, or serving lake fish in a butter and sage sauce and rabbit infused with the flavor of aromatic herbs

Alfa Romeo is one of the most storied luxury car brands, and your private guided visit to the Museo Alfa Romeo this morning is sure to be a thrill for all automobile enthusiasts. After all, there's more than a century of history preserved in the museum's collections, including an exhibit on what the brand means to the Italian Carabinieri.

Bring your appetite to lunch at 2 Michelin star D'O, the brainchild of Davide Oldani. Oldani opened D'O in 2003, and immediately garnered attention for his approach, called "cucina POP," a mix of accessibility and seasonality. The renowned chef has spoken at Harvard Business School about his entrepreneurship experience, was named CONI Food & Sport Ambassador, and even served as chef for the Italians at the Rio de Janeiro Olympics in 2016. At Oldani's D'O, simple preparation allows the flavors behind four different tasting menus to shine.

To visit Zagato, the car design factory named for Ugo Zagato, is to understand the beautiful history of Italian automotives, and you'll have the chance to do so this afternoon. It was here that models such as the Fulvia Sport and Maserati Spyder got their big debut. Thanks to Zagato's relationship with Alfa Romeo, the factory often built special-edition models for Alfa Romeo and others. This factory is not a typical museum or showroom, but a paradise of sorts for car connoisseurs, and your visit will be a great way of rounding out the automotive journey you've been on for the past week.

Tonight over dinner you'll reflect on the last eight days knowing you're leaving Italy better than you found it,

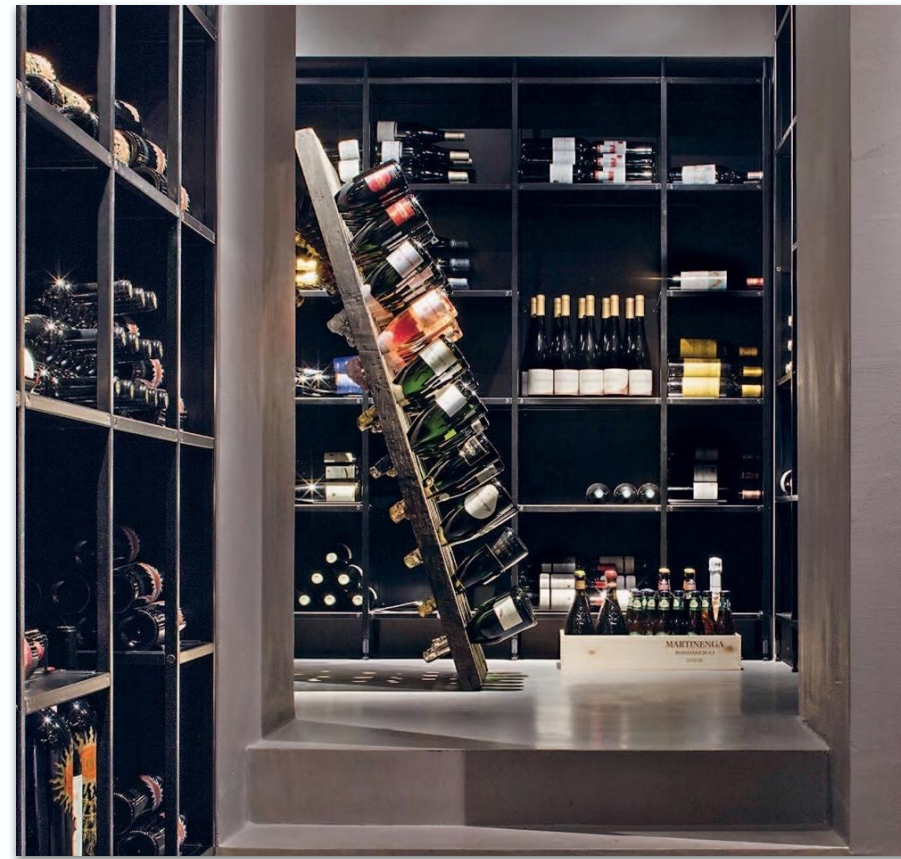

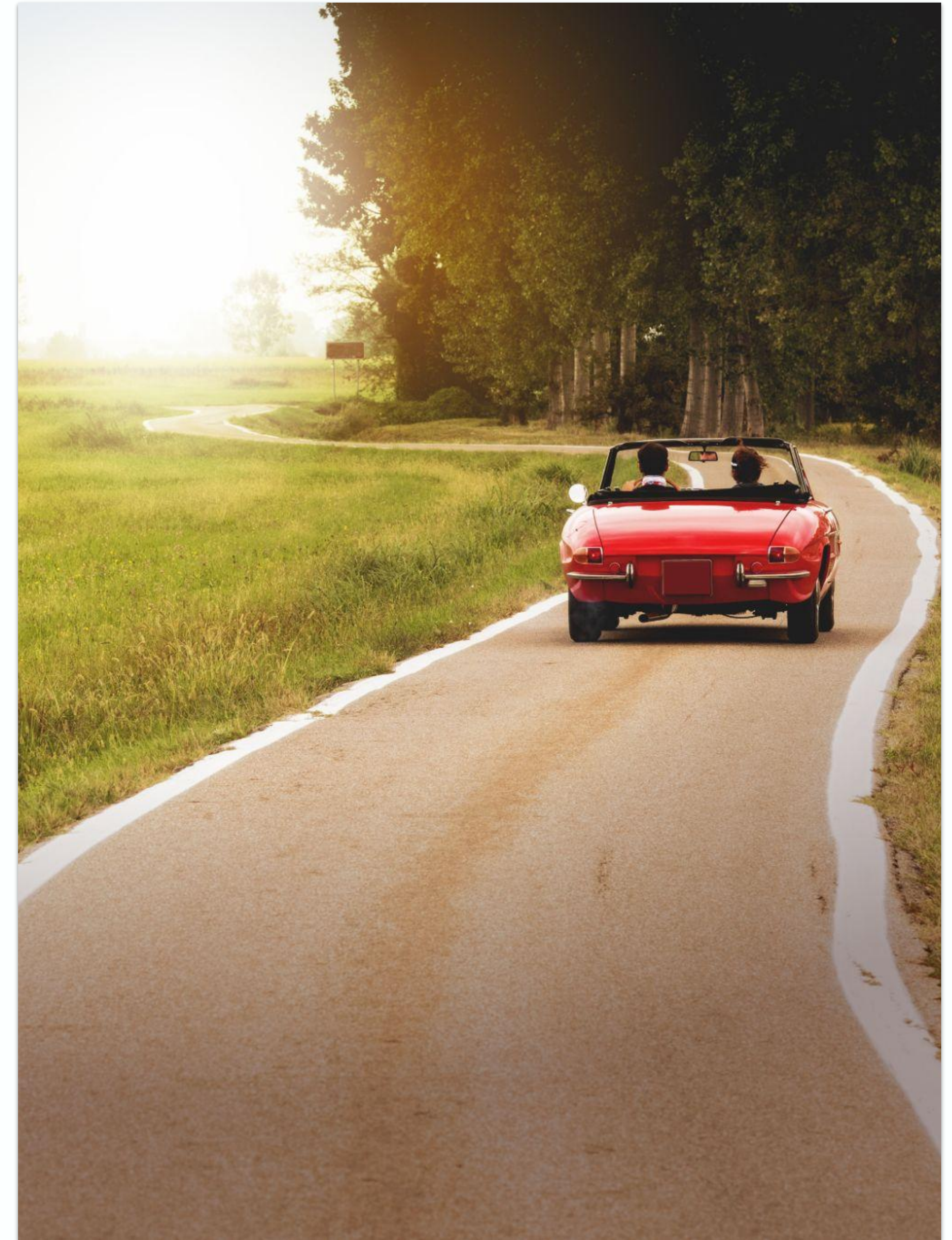

HOW WE DO IT

Associazione CAF is the first center in Italy dedicated to the reception, therapy, and study of child maltreatment and abuse. We offer clinical help and professional psychological support to child victims of maltreatment while also offering psycho-pedagogical support to their parents, mostly mothers who often are victims of abuse themselves. We help them recover (or sometimes even learn from scratch) their parental role and help families heal as a unit with the goal of interrupting the transmission chain of high-risk behavior.
